What is Project Harmony?

At Roman Music Therapy Services, we believe that community music therapy addresses the needs we all share: to belong, to feel included, and to be part of meaningful, shared experiences. Authentic friendship, inclusive communities, and mutually beneficial activities are universal needs that can be addressed through music therapy services which promote and reinforce interpersonal connections.

In an ongoing effort to create programming that meets all of these human needs, we launched Project Harmony in the fall of 2017. Whether a participant is singing their heart out at karaoke night or an adult with disabilities is participating in the Project Harmony Chorus for the first time, there is something for everybody! No musical ability is needed, only the desire to meet new people and have fun.

Project Harmony offers ongoing series and individual events that provide:

- Meaningful social experiences
- Creative self-expression
- Interactive learning and growth
- Sense of belonging
- Enhanced physical health and well-being

Project Harmony Strikes a Chord

Many adults with disabilities say that their high school choral group or band was the best time of their lives. We have replicated that opportunity for joy and enthusiasm in our Project Harmony Choral Group!

On December 18, 2017, after 10 weeks of rehearsal, the Project Harmony Choral group assembled in the basement of the Unitarian Universalist Church in Wakefield. The energy of the performers was palpable as they took their places on stage. Friends from their day program, as well as other community groups we partner with, came to see the Project Harmony Chorus sing. There had been a lot of audience interest in the weeks leading up to the Showcase, but nothing prepared us for the amount of people in attendance. At 85 attendees, the response had been bigger than any of us could imagine!

With an enthusiasm and pride that brightened their faces, the Project Harmony Chorus delivered an electric, fun and enthusiastic performance! The crowd was engaged from the beginning, singing along to old holiday favorites and cheering on their friends on stage. What a special and heartwarming afternoon it turned out to be!


KARAOKE: A NIGHT OF STARS


It Takes a Community Committed to Each Other
